Under normal circumstances, in-person well child care (WCC) visits between the provider, child and caregiver remain the standard of care as they facilitate joint discussion and careful physical exam. During the COVID pandemic, the benefits of WCC must be weighed against the real risk of infection for child, caregiver, provider and other patients.

Well-Child Visits for Infants and Young Children ...

To the extent possible, when washing, feeding, or holding very

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young children: Child care providers can protect themselves by wearing an over-large button-down, long sleeved shirt and by wearing long hair up off the collar in a ponytail or other updo. Child care providers should wash their hands, neck, and anywhere touched by a child's secretions.

Each child and family is unique; therefore, these recommendations are designed for the care of children who are receiving competent parenting, have no manifestations of any important health problems, and are growing and developing in a satisfactory fashion. Additional visits may become necessary if circumstances suggest variations from normal.

On at least 1 well-child visit educate parents about increased risk of sexual exploitation, and remind them that likely perpetrators are people their child knows and trusts, not strangers. At least once between 1 and 5 years of age, as with discussion in the first year of life, discuss future pregnancy planning and review risk of recurrence of Down syndrome and availability of prenatal diagnosis.

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Child Visits in the First 15 Months of Life: Assesses children who turned 15 months old during the measurement year and had 0-6 well-child visits with a primary care physician during their first 15 months of life.

What to expect as your child grows ; Write down your questions and concerns and bring them with you. This will help you get the most out of the visit. Your provider will pay special attention to how your child is growing compared to normal developmental milestones. The child's height, weight, and head circumference are recorded on a growth chart.
